Policies

Failure to comply with these policies may result in revocation of membership or membership rights.

Safety Policies:

- Except for ingress and egress, the front gate must be closed whenever horses are on the grounds. The gate and blockhouse must be locked when the last member leaves the grounds.
- Always bring a cell phone to the field in case of emergency. There is no pay phone on the grounds.
- No Jumping Alone
- Riders under 18 must be supervised by an adult at all times and may not jump on the cross-country without a qualified coach.
- SEI approved helmets must be worn by junior riders at all times when mounted, including shows and exhibitions. SEI approved helmets are required for all jumping activities for all riders, and strongly suggested for adults in all mounted activities.
- No bicycle riding while other member's horses are on the grounds.
- No turnout in the arenas when other members are mounted anywhere on the grounds.
- No lounging with mounted riders.
- No one may ride on the cross-country course during a rail shows
- Lounging during shows is allowed in designated areas only.
- Do not leave horses unattended at the field at any time.
- Dogs must be on a leash.
- Overnight privileges may only be granted by the board of directors.

Guest Policies:

- Guest passes are intended only for occasional, out-of-town guests. Guest passes may never be used for instructional purposes or for showing a horse for sale (Members may ride sale horses, but non-members may not try or show any horse for sale)
- Guests are limited to no more than two (2) visits per year.
- Members must make advance arrangements prior to bringing guests to the field. The member is responsible for ensuring that waivers are completed and submitted prior to the guest's arrival at the field. The member must accompany the guest throughout their stay at the field and is responsible for all actions of the guest.
- Procedure for obtaining a guest pass:
 - Download and sign a membership waiver and a guest pass from the website at www.fallbrookriders.com. All sections must be completed on both forms. All signatures must be completed for minors-*both parents must sign!* And each guest must have a waiver, even if not riding.

- The signed membership waiver must be delivered in person to a board member or faxed to 760-728-2166 prior to the guests arrival at the field. Faxed original waivers and the guest passes are to be left in the wall file in the blockhouse.
- *Junior guests must be accompanied by a parent and their waiver must be signed by both parents.*

Courtesy Policies:

- Pick up manure and clean corrals after use. Place manure in dumpster
- Place all trash in trash containers, Empty trash containers into dumpster

Use of the Field

- Always check the field schedule at www.fallbrookriders.com prior to planning a ride or an activity at the field!
- Members may use the field at any time except when scheduled as Exclusive Use. Exclusive use indicates that a competition is scheduled, or the field has been rented to another organization. Individual members may **NOT** use the field on those days unless entered in the competition or the other organizations activity.
- When subset clubs or other groups have lessons or activities scheduled on the calendar, members not involved in the club may use the field, but should yield to the scheduled activities. For example, if Riverside Hills Pony Club is scheduled for lessons on a Saturday afternoon, individual members may also use the field on Saturday afternoons, but may not use the arena or area of the cross-country course where lessons going on simultaneously, so riding areas may be quite limited during their lesson times, but other clubs usually have only one group scheduled at any given hour.
- Use courtesy whenever lessons are underway. Check with instructors prior to galloping or jumping on the cross-country or lounging or galloping in the warm-up arena. Some lessons have horses with beginning riders who are easily frightened by those activities. **Safety is our primary concern!**

Trainer/Instructors:

- A trainer or instructor is defined as anyone offering schooling, instruction, or advice to a rider that exceeds normal parental supervision. The exchange of money is not a consideration in defining a trainer/instructor for the following requirements.
- Individual trainers and instructors may teach at the field only if the trainer/instructor and all of the students are members of Fallbrook Riders Inc.
- The trainer/instructor must be approved by the board of directors and provide verification of an insurance policy in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 with "Fallbrook Riders, Inc., its board of directors, employees and agents" named as additional insured.
- Trainers employed by member clubs must provide their own insurance to teach any additional lessons at the field outside their club activities, including private lessons to their club members.

- Individual trainers are expected to share the field and arenas with other trainers and individual members. Individual trainers should not plan lessons during scheduled club activities unless prior arrangements have been made.

Injuries or Property Damage

- If injuries or property damage occurs, after obtaining appropriate medical care, members must complete an Incident Report and notify a board member by phone. Incident reports may later be hand delivered to any board member or faxed to 760-728-2166. Forms are available in the file holder in the blockhouse or online at www.fallbrookriders.com
